Meeting Minutes - Sept. 16, 2021

1. Call to Order:

5. Review Articles for Special Town Meeting:

a. Nine amendments to the approved FY22 Budget were proposed, as follows:

- i. Special Counsel & Town Clerk: Offsetting \$20,000, net effect \$0
- ii. Four Conservation related line items, totaling a \$10,495 increase
- iii. Planning Salary & Wages, a \$7,000 increase
- iv. Pentucket Education, a \$93,357 decrease
- v. Essex County Retirement Fund, a \$31,178 decrease
- vi. The FY 22 Budget Amendments above, total \$107,040 decrease GR - motion to approve Budget Amendments, with the exception of the Planning Dept. \$7K increase, pending approval by Select Board. NK- 2nd. Fin Comm unanimously approved the remaining Budget Amendments 4-0
- b. Board of Health: Expand usage of \$100K approved in Article 9 of STM to include seasonal flu vaccine & contact tracing efforts. No addit. money to be expended.
 - i. NK motion to approve. JH 2nd. Fin Comm approved unanimously 4-0. FC booklet narrative: JH
- c. Funding for invasive species internship program \$8,000, for spring/summer '22
 - i. NK motion to approve. JH 2nd. Questions/comments:
 - 1. JS: similar article withdrawn at STM, due to uncertainly with intern oversight. RP: Conservation Agent (Michelle Green) & Nancy Pau will supervise interns and provide guidance.
 - 2. NK: will this include invasive eradication, e.g., on Town owned land at Pentucket School. RP: will include some mechanical treatment & planting native plants in their place.
 - 3. GR: homeowner education is crucial. NP/RP: will encourage education & outreach. This is not a one year task.
 - 4. Fin Comm approved unanimously 4-0. FC booklet narrative: JS
- d. Adoption of Mass General Law (MGL), Chapter 59, Section 8A Local option for Exemption of Excise Tax on Farm Machinery and Animals. Per Chief Assessor, if adopted will result in loss of approx. \$8,000 in tax revenue.
 - i. NK motion to approve. JH 2nd. Questions/comments:
 - 1. GR: what animals are included, e.g., horses? AJ: only animals used for active farming, not recreation purposes.

- 2. JH: where does excise tax go? AJ: general revenue, similar to car excise tax, etc.
- 3. JH: does the entire excise tax collection go to WN, or do we share a portion with State. AJ: believe all goes to WN.
- 4. JS: any repercussions for prior years? AJ: can go back up to 3 years, if taxpayer applies
- 5. Fin Comm approved unanimously, 4-0.
- e. Adoption of MGL, Ch. 59, Sec. 57A, combining low tax bills. Tax bills <\$100 will be due and payable in one installment. Per Kaitlin Gilbert, Treasurer/Collector, WN's current system allowing quarterly installment payments, for low balances, is inefficient.
 - i. GR motion to approve. JH 2nd
 - ii. Fin Comm approved unanimously, 4-0
- f. Adoption of MGL, Ch. 33, Sec. 59, statute for employees serving in military. Presented by Sargent Johnson, WNPD.
 - i. NK motion to approve. JH 2^{nd} . Questions/comments:
 - ii. JH: does this law apply to part-time, as well as full-time employees? SJ/AJ: no definitive answer on this in statute, but service member will receive a stipend for the <u>difference</u> in wages, between their regular (WN) salary vs. military salary.
 - iii. Fin Comm approved unanimously, 4-0
- g. Adoption of MGL, Ch. 44, Sec. 55C, establish affordable housing trust fund.
 - i. GR motion to approve. JH 2nd. Questions/comments:
 - ii. JS: how will this work in practice and how does it differ from CPA, which also contains an affordable housing component? AJ: Select Board would establish a framework for the trust fund, with no initial funding as part of this article. If funded in future, 100% will be earmarked toward affordable housing, vs. CPA where as little as 10% can be allotted to Aff. Housing.
 - iii. Fin Comm approved unanimously, 4-0
- h. Green Communities Grant (matching) Funds, up to \$10,000, earmarked for HVAC repair in 1910 & Council on Aging Bldg. Grant applic. Due Oct. 2021
 - i. NK motion to approve. JH 2^{nd} . Questions/comments:
 - ii. JH: Must we go with B2Q, or will this service be bid-out via RFQ? AJ: BtQ is on state bid list, and with an amount this small, will not require us to follow a bid process.
 - iii. NK: In B2Q proposal, total cost is \$50K. Will we be asking the Town for an addit. \$30K in future? AJ: No, we don't anticipate this, as Nat'l Grid will also offer incentives.
 - iv. Fin Comm approved unanimously, 4-0
