

Rules and Regulations Part 1

Since West Newbury's incorporation in 1819, Town government has been responsible for the enforcement of the keeping of records with regard to rules and regulations, some of which are comical relics of the past, and some which are timely as ever in the 21st century.

Tax Collection

You name it, there's probably been a tax on it: teas to turnpikes, meals to motor vehicles. The lifeblood of any Town operations and an assertion of its sovereignty, tax collection has been enforced in West Newbury since its break from Newbury. At right is the Tax Collector's Report for 1884.

For the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required by us the subscribers, Assessors of said towns, to levy and collect of the several persons named in the list herewith committted to you, and of each one his respective proportion therein set down of the sum total of such list, the sum of thirteen hundred and twenty ^{two} (\$1322.00) it being this towns proportion of a State Tax of two millions dollars granted by the last General Court of said Commonwealth for defraying the necessary charges and expenses of the Commonwealth, aforesaid.

And a tax of thirteen hundred and fifteen dollars and sixty-four cents (\$1315.64) it being this towns proportion of a tax of two hundred and five thousand dollars, granted by the last General Court of said Commonwealth, for defraying the necessary charges and expenses of the County of Essex, aforesaid.

And a tax of twelve thousand seven hundred dollars (anticipated receipts being deducted amounting to the sum of two thousand two hundred dollars) voted and agreed upon by the town aforesaid, at a meeting lawfully held for that purpose on the third day of March, last, for defraying the necessary charges and expenses thereof, together with the sum of six hundred and seven dollars and ninety-two cents (\$607.92), it being the overlappings of said taxes, and a tax of one hundred and forty-three dollars and seventy-six cents (\$143.76) it being the amount assessed the several persons whose names are in the list aforesaid, and severally due from them on account of School Books, in accordance with the provisions of Section 38 of Chapter 44 of the Public Statutes.

And you are to complete and make up an account of the collection of the whole sum, amounting to sixteen thousand and eighty-seven dollars and thirty-two cents (\$16,087.32) and transmit and pay over the same as follows, to wit:—

To E. Kendall Jenkins Esquire, Treasurer of the County of Essex or his Successor in said office, on or before the first day of November, next amounting hereof the sum of thirteen
