- 1. <u>Meeting Minutes</u>: Both the April and August Minutes were approved.
- 2. <u>Participation in Apple Harvest Road Race</u>: Jean will do a flyer and take them to the Apple Harvest Road Race on Sept. 30. Jean also suggested having a banner made to put up at public events. It was suggested that it read:

3. <u>Trail Easement Promotional Info</u>: There was discussion about an inventory of the trail easements being done, most of which are in the OSC Plan. He is very interested in the "Right to Farm" bill and would like to see one in West Newbury. Jennifer agreed to speak to The Artichoke Farm and see if they are familiar with the "Right to Farm Bill." Mr. McNamara also suggested that the Farm Bureau Federation has been helpful to many communities in keeping farm land for farming. It was agreed that further discussion of this would be put on the October Agenda.

- 5. <u>Ocean Meadow Project</u>: The bridge project is almost complete with just a few small things to be finished. The weekend that most of the work was done was a big success and thanks were given to all who helped.
