Additional Historically significant sites

In 2006, the following resources within the Town were deemed historically significant by the Historical Commission: • Training Field, which includes the Town Hall, the G.A.R. Memorial Library, and houses surrounding the Training Field • 1910 Building • The Second Congregational Church • St. Ann's Church • All Saint's Church and St. John's Hall • Civil War Memorial, now known as the Charles L. Carr Post

In 2011, the Historical Commission deemed the Page School, including the Mill Pond Dam, the Pipestave Hill Apartment Building, and the Pipestave/Mill Pond Recreational areas on both sides of Route 113 as historically significant.
