- Ongoing operation cost allocation
- Ongoing capital cost allocation
- Agreement modification
- Agreement withdrawal requirements



Municipality Involvement

- Whittier School Committee consists of:
 - Two members from each City
 - $\circ~$ One member from each Town
- Appointed by School Committees
- No formal role for municipal officials
- Rely on Whittier for updates, financial information, long term planning








Student Enrollment 2015-2022

- Outdated mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems
- No fire suppression system
- Inadequate access road
- Aging wastewater treatment plant
- Not ADA compliant

- First and second floors vocational, specialty, support and community spaces
- Third floor academic classes
- Theater, gymnasium, band and chorus rooms, fitness room
- 4 baseball diamonds, 4 sport courts and 2 fields (original stadium remains)
- Student enrollment remains the same (1,280 students)

Options for Project Funding

- Fund within property tax levy limit
- Fund above property tax levy limit
 - $\circ \text{Override}$
 - \circ Debt exclusion
- Make budget reductions
- Use other available funds (free cash, stabilization etc.)



January 23, 2023 Vote:

"Do you approve of the vote of the Regional District School committee of the Whittier Regional Vocational Technical School District, adopted on December 13, 2023,to authorize the borrowing of four hundred fortyfour million, six-hundred thirteen thousand, eighthundred thirteen dollars(\$444,613,813) to pay costs of designing, constructing, originally equipping and furnishing a new District high school to be located at115 Amesbury Line Road, Haverhill, Massachusetts including the payment of all costs incidental or related thereto."



What Will a Yes Vote Mean?

- A simple majority of the total of all district members casting a vote on Jan 23
- Whittier is authorized to borrow funds
- District members will have to come up with funding independently
- Members will be committed to all costs above project estimates



What Will a No Vote Mean?

- Project loses current MSBA funding (\$ 159.7 M) but can reapply
- Alternative projects or renovations will have to be explored
- Whittier will have to obtain 2/3 approval for any capital expenses from 11 District Members
